<sup>1</sup> Passing the licensure exam is an admissions requirement of the BSN and MSN programs; therefore, 100% of program completers pass the exam prior to starting the nursing program.

<sup>2</sup> RN to BSN completion rates are measured from August to July. MSN completion rates are measured August to May, and completion is defined as 6-7 semesters.

<sup>3</sup> For the BSN, part-time (PT) completion is defined as 6 to 7 semesters, and full-time (FT) completion is defined as 3-4 semesters. MSN Program is only offered part-time (PT).

<sup>4</sup> Students included in this statistic self-reported that they were working full-time in the field of Nursing. Remaining students chose not to report their employment status, were working part-time in the field of nursing, were working outside of nursing, or were unemployed. For the BSN, less than 2% of students reported being unemployed across all three years. For the MSN, no students reported being unemployed.
